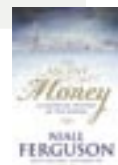

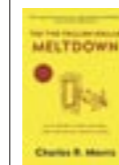

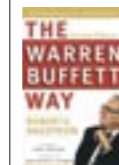
time doing research rather than inspections as most buyers do. Paul Do's systematic approach to property investing also provides readers with a framework for building a real estate portfolio.

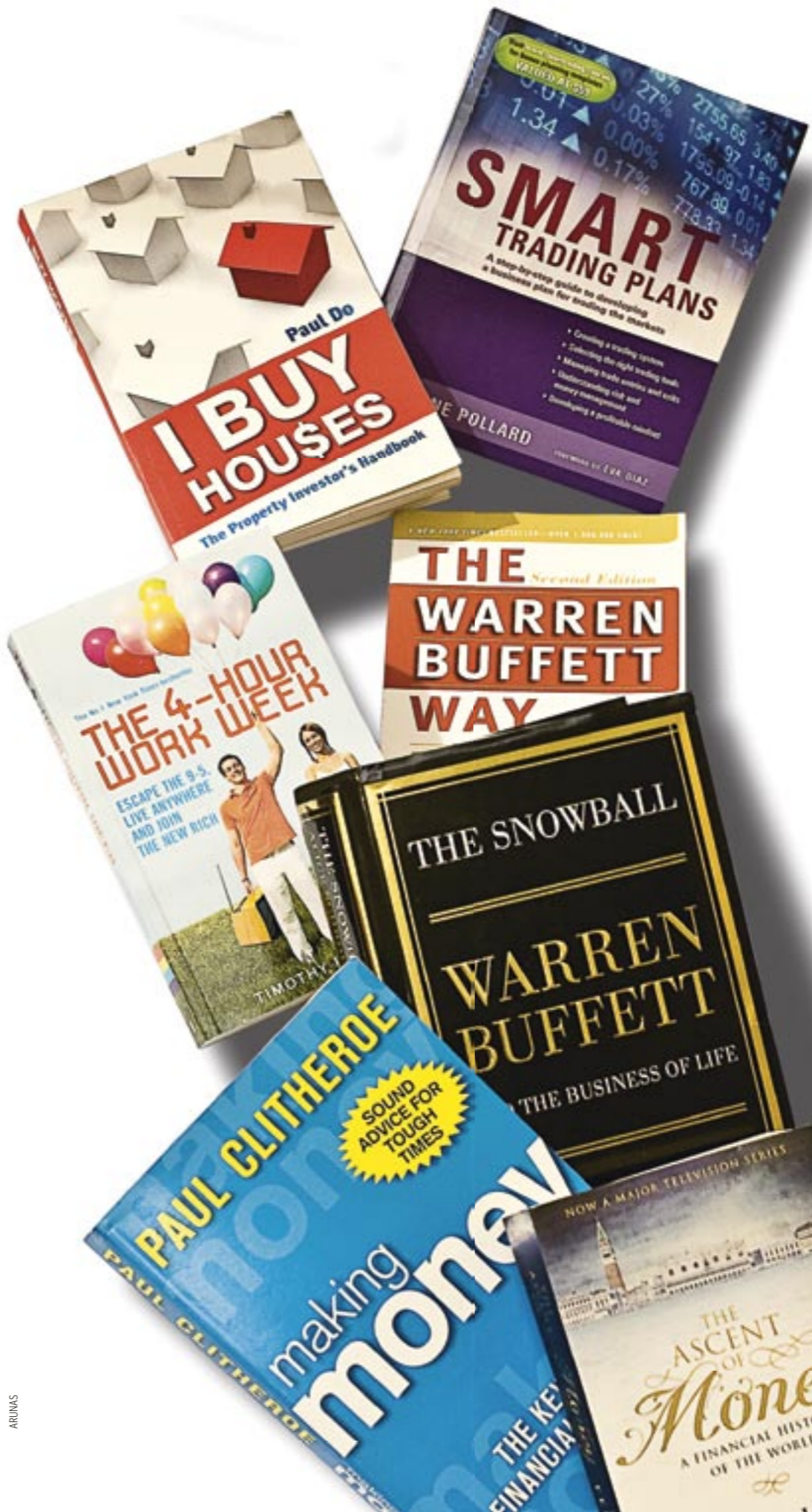
